


PAC AREA Statistics*



The 2013 goal for D11NR is 12,500 VSC's. We are 20% of our goal and 60% of 2012 production. Stats from AUXINFO* indicate that 78% or 1,996 have passed, 1,010 or 39% are First Time VSC's, and 963 or 38% are High Risk VSC's. In addition, or 13% are paddlecraft VSC's. The data source is AUXINFO*. *Statistics as shown in AUXINFO thru June 1st, 2013

VSC Questions: Back by popular demand! These are actual test questions from the 2007 VE Exam Version "F" Answers can be found in another location in the newsletter 1. You've just completed a VSC on a vessel that passes and is eligible for a decal. However, the vessel does not have a windshield. What do you do now? Give the owner or operator the decal and let them decide where they would like it.

- a. Give the owner or operator the decal and let them decide where they would like it.
- b. Since you may only place a decal on the window or windshield, you never should have done a VSC on this boat in the first place. It was a waste of your time and the owner's time.

- c. Place the new decal on the dashboard or back of a seat; someplace that will be readily visible to authorities while underway.
- d. Save the new decal for your next VSC and just give the owner the Form 7012 indicating their boat earned a decal.

- **Operation Dry Water** over the weekend of June 28th-30th is national effort sponsored by NASLBA to support the local law enforcement jurisdictions to combat drinking and boating under the influence on our local waterways. As you know, boating under the influence can ruin a great day on the water and 16% of boating fatalities are a result of alcohol use. In recent years, this program has also been supported by the Coast Guard and held in conjunction with the Delta Blitz events. This year, because of funding the Coast Guard will not participating in this important program. However, we as Vessel Examiners (VE's) can man our local launch ramps and perform VSC's and help educate the boaters prior to launching. Please consider planning a local VSC station.

- Please remember prior to submitting **any** paperwork, whether to your FSO-IS or DIRAUX to **ALWAYS** keep a copy for your records. In addition, it is **your** responsibility to submit your 7038's and MT-2 forms on a timely basis-preferably ASAP after you've completed a recent activity. While I 'm always willing to help out with individual qualification and/or recognition issues, your 1st stop for assistance should be with your Flotilla Commander. The ultimate responsibility for <u>accurate and timely</u> reporting of VSC activities lies with <u>each</u> individual Examiner.
