



D11NR Statistics*

Stats from AUXINFO* indicate that we are 42% of our goal and 60% of 2012 production. Additional stats from AUXINFO* indicate that 78% or 4,173 have passed the VSC, 41% or 2,183 are First Time VSC's, and 41% or 2,179 are High Risk VSC's. 1. Operational Facility radio equipment:

National and District News

<u>National News</u>

-I've been notified by National that ANSC is out of VSC decals and there is no point in placing additional orders. Nationally, we started off with over 200,000 VSC decals and approx. 12,500 here in D11NR. However, there are more than enough decals in the hands of our local VE's to finish up the year. We have only awarded approx. 3,800 decals here in D11NR, which leaves us with about 9,000 or 60% still in circulation. We simply need to get the unused decals to the people who may need them. So, please consider bringing any unused decals to your upcoming flotilla meeting so they can be re-distributed. While I'm not a backup source of decals, if you need help in finding out where the excess decals are, I can provide FC's with a listing of decals sent to each of your flotillas YTD. I hope that by giving you a heads-up this will help prevent any scrambling around at the last minute trying to obtain decals. Additionally, if you are holding any 7038's, please submit them ASAP. Finally, as a result of our reduced 2013 VSC activity expect our 2014 VSC decal allocations to drop. Source: Randy Ernst ANSC Mike Lauro DSO-VE

-Below is the response to an inquiry I made to the Auxiliary Tech Support regarding performing a VSC on Standup Paddlecraft-

"Stand up paddlecraft do qualify for a VSC. From the USCG, **"Stand Up Paddleboards** are required to carry the same safety equipment as all paddle craft per Federal Regulations." When doing the VSC, make sure to use <u>Form 7012A</u> and report them on the 2nd line of the 7038 under "Vessel Safety Checks-Paddlecraft".
